- 1. <u>**Transitional Kindergarten**</u> Our brand new Transitional Kindergarten will open its doors to many little 4 year olds ready for a fun-filled academic experience come September.
- 2. <u>Physical upgrades</u> The interior of the school will go through a much needed refurbishment. New floors will be put in, walls will be cleaned, repaired, spackled and painted. In addition, new lighting will be put in to make our school more cost and energy efficient.
- 3. Setting high expectations for students Expecting students to succeed -My vision to make SMMS the best academic school intensifies. While it's true that we are indeed a high performing school, I have designed an ambitious plan that EXPECTS ALL SMMS STUDENTS TO SUCCEED. I firmly believe that every student has the potential to be successful. It is my responsibility, and of the partnership between the school and the parents, to make it happen.
